MISSISSIPPI STATE PERSONNEL BOARD EMPLOYEES SERVE THE MISSISSIPPI FOOD NETWORK

Jackson, Miss. (April 14, 2016) – The Mississippi State Personnel Board partnered with the Mississippi Food Network for MSPB’s spring community service project. Over the course of two weeks, MSPB team members donated more than 1,000 non-perishable food items to provide over 500 meals to those in need. They volunteered at the Mississippi Food Network including participating in MFN’s Volunteer Saturday. In addition, MSPB team members enrolled in the Kroger Community Rewards program to benefit MFN.

Mississippi Food Network has been feeding Mississippians since 1984. MFN distributes more than 1.5 million pounds of food and feeds more than 150,000 individuals every month — or a total of 1.8 million people per year. MFN takes donations from multiple sources, and distributes food and goods through 430 member agencies. They, in turn, distribute to recipients in their own communities.

“Through donations and volunteer service to the Mississippi Food Network, the Mississippi State Personnel Board team is proud to assist in fighting hunger in Mississippi,” said MSPB Executive Director Deanne Mosley.
